How to find us

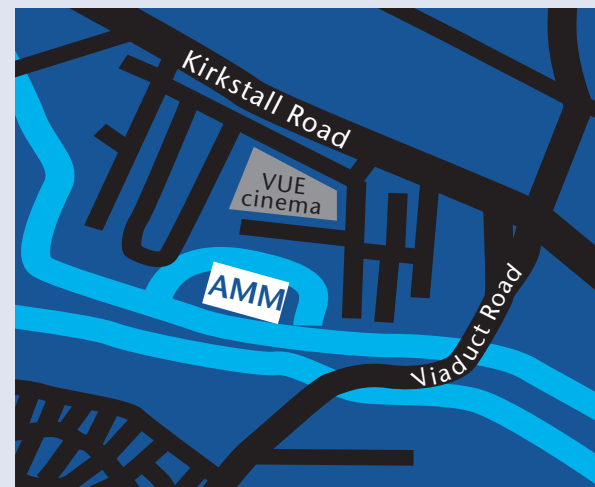
By car

2 miles from Leeds city centre on Canal Road, off the A65 (Kirkstall Road). Parking is available at Armley Mills as well as in the large car park at the VUE Cinema complex. Armley Mills can be accessed via a bridge from the complex.

By public transport

Armley Mills is served by no. 5 bus that picks up at Leeds train station in Leeds City Centre. Services 733, 734, 735, 736 go to the VUE cinema complex on Kirkstall Road. Armley Mills can be accessed from a foot bridge at the rear of the complex.

Explore...

Spend some time exploring Armley Mills and discover Leeds' industrial heritage...

Armley Mills contains exhibits from the 18th century to the present day and tells the history of manufacturing in Leeds, including textiles, clothing, printing and engineering.

In purpose-built mill buildings and nestled in the Kirkstall Valley, Armley Mills contains a wealth of gems from Leeds' industrial era.



Learn...

See the machines that were once powered by the Mill's impressive waterwheel. Discover how the looms and spinning 'mules' turned wool into cloth. Visit the tailoring gallery to see how this cloth became gentlemen's suits. See why tailoring became a major industry in 19th and 20th century Leeds.

Discover...

Discover how the Leeds' printing industry began with the museum's collection of printing hand presses. See how printing grew, and learn some printer's secrets! Explore the 'Optics Galleries' to find out about cinema history and how the world's first moving pictures were filmed on Leeds Bridge. Visit Armley Mill's very own cinema and see the world's first moving image.



Enjoy...

Come and watch working locomotive Jack in action at Armley Mills 'Steaming Up Days'. These are held regularly from Easter to September and once a week during the summer holidays. Take part in the range of other events and activities available throughout the school holidays.



Relax...

Enjoy the quiet tranquillity of Armley Mills, just 2 miles outside of the city centre. Relax with a picnic at one of Armley Mills scenic picnic sites. After your visit enjoy an amble along the Leeds and Liverpool towpath, or pick up a leaflet about the many scenic walks from the museum. Try and spot the wildlife often seen close to Armley Mills including foxes, waterfowl, squirrels, kingfishers, herons and kestrels.
