To mark the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War, we have compiled a selection of children's books, both fiction and non-fiction, suitable for KS1 through to KS3.





	<p>Angus, Sam</p> <p>Soldier dog</p> <p>9781447220053</p> <p>£5.99</p> <p>Age range 9-11 years</p>	<p>Stanley's dad hasn't been the same since his wife died and his eldest son went off to fight in the war. Now Stanley's only friend is his dad's prize winning greyhound, Rocket. Stanley runs away and enlists in the army to train as a messenger dog handler, and is soon heading to France with a great Dane called Bones by his side</p>
	<p>Beck, Jennifer</p> <p>The Little hen and the great War</p> <p>9781407145983</p> <p>£6.99</p> <p>Age range 5-7 years</p>	<p>A young soldier is fighting in the trenches of wartime France when he finds a hen, skinny, scruffy, and starving. He tucks her into his jacket and takes her with him. The other soldiers laugh when they see him looking after her and sharing his meagre rations of food, but when the hen thrives and begins to lay eggs for them, they realise that perhaps survival and hope are possible after all.</p>
	<p>Boyne, John</p> <p>Stay where you are & then Leave</p> <p>9780857532930</p> <p>£10.99</p> <p>Age range 9-11</p>	<p>The day the First World War broke out, Alfie Summerfield's father promised he wouldn't go away to fight - but he broke that promise the following day. Four years later, Alfie doesn't know where his father might be, other than that he's away on a special, secret mission. Then, while shining shoes at King's Cross Station, Alfie unexpectedly sees his father's name - on a sheaf of papers belonging to a military doctor. Bewildered and confused, Alfie realises his father is in a hospital close by - a hospital treating soldiers with an unusual condition.</p>

	<p>Deary, Terry</p> <p>The Bomber Balloon</p> <p>9781408191651</p> <p>£4.99</p> <p>Age Range 7-9 years</p>	<p>Stories of the First World War from the bestselling Terry Deary, author of the hugely successful 'Horrible Histories'. November 1916 - the war on the Home Front. Millie is being told off for breaching the blackout when a Zeppelin airship crashes over Essex. Millie, the local constable and an elderly helper must round up the armed German crew before they escape. Meanwhile the 'invaders' are worrying about accidentally setting fire to the houses they were bombing.</p>

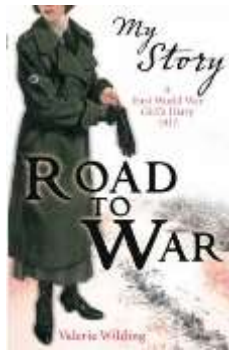

He was shot down by the famous 'Red Baron' Manfred von Richthofen over France along with his pilot Donald Stewart on 5 April 1917. They landed across enemy lines and both survived as prisoners of war. This tale tells how Alfred ended up spending his 21st birthday in a German POW camp, where he was visited by the Red Baron himself.</p>
	<p>Deary, Terry</p> <p>The pigeon spy</p> <p>9781408191712</p> <p>£4.99</p> <p>Age Range 7-9 years</p>	<p>This title features stories of the First World War from Terry Deary, author of the hugely successful 'Horrible Histories'. Flanders 1918. The extraordinary true story of a pigeon who saved nearly 200 lives. A troop of Americans are trapped behind enemy lines. Not only are their German enemies firing at them but so are their own side. Somehow they have to get a message to their comrades. The only way is by pigeon. But every time a pigeon rises in the air it is shot down. The last pigeon, a black bird called Cher Ami, flies with bullets zipping through the air all around him, covering 25 miles in just 65 minutes, helping to save the lives of the 194 survivors.</p>
