### CITY OF LEEDS METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COUNCIL (ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION IN DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES) DESIGNATION ORDER 1

The City of Leeds Metropolitan District Council hereby make the following order:

- 1 The public places described in the Schedule below, being public places in the area of the City of Leeds Metropolitan District Council and to which Sections 12 and 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2002 apply, are hereby designated for the purposes of that Act as agreed by the Licensing and Regulatory Panel, 21 June 2005.
- 2 This order may be cited as the City of Leeds Metropolitan District (Alcohol Consumption in Designated Public Places) Designation Order 1 and shall come into force on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2005.
- 3 The effect of this Order will be to make it a criminal offence to consume intoxicating liquor in a designated public place. If a constable reasonably believes that a person is or has been consuming intoxicating liquor in a designated place or intend to consume intoxicating liquor in such a place, the constable may require the person concerned:-
  - (a) not to consume in that place anything which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor;
  - (b) to surrender anything in his possession which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor or a container for such liquor, other than a sealed container.

A constable may dispose of anything surrendered to him in such manner as he considers appropriate.

A person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with a requirement imposed upon him by constable under the above Act commits an offence and is liable to arrest and upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

- 3 The effect of this Order will be to make it a criminal offence to consume intoxicating liquor in a designated public place. If a constable reasonably believes that a person is or has been consuming intoxicating liquor in a designated place or intend to consume intoxicating liquor in such a place, the constable may require the person concerned:-
  - (a) not to consume in that place anything which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor;
  - (b) to surrender anything in his possession which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor or a container for such liquor, other than a sealed container.

A constable may dispose of anything surrendered to him in such manner as he considers appropriate.

A person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with a requirement imposed upon him by constable under the above Act commits an offence and is liable to arrest and upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

  - (b) to surrender anything in his possession which is, or which the constable reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor or a container for such liquor, other than a sealed container.

A constable may dispose of anything surrendered to him in such manner as he considers appropriate.
