## Appendix 1

### Project No. 44

3 Churches Project Events & activities include those listed:

1. **“Drum for Justice”**, as part of the Make Poverty History campaign. It attracted people from local schools, community and churches and hope to use more regularly for short courses and drum circles.
2. **Digital Cameras** –a project with pupils from Carr Manor High School, where they created a book with a group of pupils, to celebrate the 800<sup>th</sup> birthday of Leeds as a city.
3. **Craft Club** - run each week on Thursday afternoons for two hours. The club is especially appreciated by people who want to get out of their house and meet new people. Special sessions run this year include marquetry and woodburning sessions, for which they had some very welcome outside input!
4. **Radio Leeds Festival workshops** - In April they hosted three workshops as part of the Radio Leeds 2007 festival. The group learned some techniques of radio journalism, using their own personal stories to create an audio piece. The pieces were entered for a Radio Leeds competition.
5. **Local Stories** The workshops were a catalyst for gathering more local stories, a project which began over a year ago, interviewed a good number of people from the local area, and recorded some of their stories and memories on CD, will be kept with locally stored archives of the area. These stories were also available to listen to as part of the Meanwood Festival.
6. **Meanwood Festival** - This week-long festival gave great opportunity to draw together different aspects of involvement with the local community through the past year. As such, it proved to be a celebration of the work of the Three Churches Project, and of growing relationships in and around the local community.
7. **Craft Parties** - ran two of these events, at the beginning and end of the summer holiday. Sixteen children age 5-11 from the local area came to the parties, which were run by volunteers from the community as well as the Church. It was a really successful event and one which they hope to repeat on a regular basis.

**8. Moortown Festival** - young women of local Muslim IQRA centre were supported by the three churches project in organising this festival. The event itself was a big success, and it opened many doors to help build bridges across cultural boundaries in locality.

**9. SOWN (Social on Wednesday Nights)** - which offers games, activities, refreshments and special events. The groups was the vision of two people living locally, who, through their own work and lives in the area, wanted to see something on offer in the evening that could be accessed by anyone, including lonely and vulnerable people. It offers transport to those who would like to come but cannot get there alone, or find it difficult to make that first step into a new group.

**10. ReFresh** - This is both a new group as well as a continuation of the work of the Two Hills Project, which had to end this year because of lack of resources. It is run by paid worker, as well as volunteers from the local community and churches. It welcomes around 20 children each week, often from recognised needy families, and is a great link with the local community.

**11. Demonstrate Day**- last major event of the year was to welcome Leeds Youth Cells Network back to Meanwood for a Demonstrate Day. The event usually sees teams of young people working on social action projects, for their own development as well as for the benefit of a local community. About 90 young people at event, plus leaders. Most of the group helped fill 3 skips and more on the Beckhill estate, with a smaller group leading an advent service at Bentley Court Residential Housing.

**12. Bridges and Relationships** – continue to represent churches at local forums and as part of work, regularly work in partnership and support of other projects, i.e. running activities for youth groups, and local schools and writing for Carr Manor High School's Community Newsletter, the Voice.

## Appendix 2

### Project No. 45

**1. Building Bridges Circle Time** - Heritage Lottery funded project, providing teachers of Key Stage 3 History, Citizenship, and RE curricula with an interactive education resource to enrich Holocaust knowledge. Interviews focus on the persecution that drove European Jews from their countries of origin, the reality of their experiences and settlement in this country. A portable exhibition makes material available to the public and a DVD supports speakers and discussion groups. The title is apt – the project seeks to build a bridge between Holocaust survivors and today's young students.

**2. Double Portraits** - The DVD is a powerful example of cross-generational and multi-cultural dialogue. It is used as a discussion group resource in schools, Young Offenders Institutions and HM Prison establishments. HFSA has participated with Kirklees Community History Service and local refugee organisations to record the sharing of experiences between Holocaust survivors and present day refugees.
