What is the Natural Resources and Waste Development Plan Document?

The Natural Resources and Waste Development Plan Document (NRWDPD) is one of the suite of policy documents within Leeds' new Local Development Framework. It aims to:

1. Ensure responsible use of natural resources such as minerals, water and energy;
2. Predict future pressures on resources, such as climate change and increased housing growth, and plan for these by reducing flood risk, improving air quality and increasing renewable energy provision;
3. Ensure that sufficient sites are provided to enable us to manage our waste;
4. Increase waste recycling and processing so that less waste goes to landfill;
5. Encourage more use of those resources that don't run out, such as solar and wind energy.
