

Clean Air Charging Zone (CAZ) Signage

The governments Clean Air Zone (CAZ) framework has requested a minimum standard for setting up a CAZ. Part of the requirement is to “have in place signs along major access routes to clearly delineate the zone”. Leeds City Council is required to have clear signage where vehicles enter into a charging CAZ, as well as signs in advance of entry, which will be key to providing drivers with adequate information about the potential charges applicable to their vehicle and to provide alternative routes for those who wish to divert around it.

A clear and uniformed sign is critical for those who may be entering a charging CAZ. To ensure a national standard, the design of the symbol and traffic sign was produced centrally by the Joint Air Quality Unit (JAQU), who worked closely on the development of the sign with the Department for Transport (DfT).

These signs will be used for all Clean Air Zones across the country to provide consistency for drivers travelling between CAZs.

The signs in the following are examples only for the purpose of this consultation. “Korfield Council” would therefore be replaced with “Leeds City Council” in final signs.
