## Regulation 19 Draft - Duty to Cooperate table summarising relevant strategic matters that need to be addressed

Section 110 of the Localism Act 2011, imposes a duty on councils to co-operate with other Local Planning Authorities and prescribed bodies on planning issues that cross administrative boundaries. The duty is explained in the National Planning Policy Framework at paragraphs 24 to 27 with guidance on what constitutes a strategic matter at paragraphs 20 to 23. The intention of the legislation is that the duty is carried out before councils make formal decisions on plans, with those decisions taking account of the outcome of the co-operation process.

The Duty to Co-operate Group has been consulted on the Local Plan Update and the table below sets out the Council's views on the Strategic Issues arising from the draft policies. Given the scope and nature of the policy topic areas there are very few matters that are Strategic issues which are likely to give rise to cross boundary concerns because most policies being proposed relate to the design of specific developments. However, Policy EN3 on Renewable Energy Generation has been identified as having potential for cross boundary impacts because identifies areas as suitable for wind energy development.

The table below sets out an analysis of issues and proposed actions that the Council has identified to date which may impact on neighbouring LPA's and the interests of proscribed bodies. This information will be central to demonstrating that the duty has been carried out appropriately. Where a cross boundary issues has been highlighted rows are highlighted in amber.




